- **2 910** prisoners* (8% women)
 - **5 546** entries from freedom in 2018
- 2 959 community sanction clients*
- **26** prisons (of which 11 open)
- 14 community sanctions offices
- 2 496 employees** (41% women)(of which approx. 250 in community sanctions)



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
MAIN CHARACTERISTICS (1/2)

- Low prisoner rate: 51 / 100 000
 - Russia: 366, USA: 655 *
- Transition towards a more open enforcement of sentences:
 - Prisons $(\sim 1/2) \rightarrow$ Community sanctions $(\sim 1/2)$
 - Closed prisons (\sim 2/3) \rightarrow Open prisons (\sim 1/3)
- Short prison terms
 - Average length of actualized prison term 11 months
 - Nearly half less than 3 month

MAIN CHARACTERISTICS (2/2)

- Gradual release
- Exceptionally low amount of under-aged (<18) or juveniles (<21) in prisons.*
- High number of violent offenders (about 3 x Western Europe)
- High amount (almost 90%) of prisoners with serious substance abuse problem (alcohol and/or drugs/medication)



COSTS

The overall costs of the criminal sanctions field about 210 M€

Costs per prisoner per year 67 000 €


closed prison 78 000 € (214 € per day)

open prison 54 000 € (149 € per day)


Costs per community sanction client per year 5 000 €




